On Friday September 10, 2010 **The Ancient Order of Hibernians - New York County Board** and its related divisions in association with the **Friends of the Fighting 69th** and the **United War Veterans Council** is proud to present the special private screening of the award winning feature documentary **CHOSIN**. In November & December of 1950 15,000 U.S. soldiers crossed the 38th parallel in an attempt to drive back the Korean Army. They quickly encountered a force comprised of more than 120,000 Chinese soldiers at Chosin Reservoir. For 17 days these soldiers and marines fought the Chinese along the 78 mile length of the reservoir in -30 degree temperatures; ultimately, they liberated 98,000 civilian refugees.

The Chosin Reservoir Campaign is taught to every single Marine recruit at boot camp, along with the battles Belleau Wood and Iwo Jima, as one of the seminal battles of the Marine Corps' proud history.

2010 marks the 60th anniversary of the beginning of the Korean War and the 60th anniversary of the battle of Chosin Reservoir. This film is a must see for anyone who wishes to garner a better understanding of the **Forgotten War, the Korean Conflict**.

Veterans Day 2010 is dedicated to all those who served in the U.S. military during the Korean War. We are proud to have been selected to host a screening of this incredible film, winner of the **2010 GI Film Festival - Best Feature Documentary**. The film will be shown at the 69th Regiment Armory on Lexington Avenue & 25th Street at 7:00PM on Friday, September 10th. A cocktail hour will precede the film from 6PM - 7PM in the General Duffy Room. Immediately following the screening there will be a reception with the filmmakers, CPT Brian Inglesius (USMC-ret) and CPT Anton Sattler (USMC-ret), as well as some Chosin Reservoir veterans in the General Duffy Room featuring an open bar & buffet.

Seating is limited; tickets are available on-line at CHOSIN Tickets and are priced at \$40. This is a great deal for a night at the movies and an open bar/buffet.
